

Islam, Refugees and the English Defence League

Is it right for a nation to bring within its borders the seeds of its own destruction?



Morality - We are a generous nation

The EDL is not against immigration. As a country and as human beings, we have a moral obligation to assist refugees. However, just as we are not allowed to settle wherever we like so refugees have no right to decide where they settle. As a nation, we have a right to turn refugees away when our own national safety and integrity are at risk. A nation that cannot or will not protect its own citizens will soon not be a nation.

Open Borders - We must be rational, not emotional and irrational

The open borders crowd [OBC], the European elites and our servile politicians would have this country take in as many refugees as want to come here. The media constantly talk about our 'moral obligations' but never answer the basic questions like: how many refugees would fulfil our moral obligations; for how long would they be allowed to stay; and would the OBC cooperate with their removal once their time is up? Few of the elites speak of the moral obligations of Muslim-controlled countries, where there is space, wealth and resources aplenty, to accept these almost countless Muslim refugees. Of course, the current migration from Africa and Asia bears no relationship to earlier, smaller, more desperate movements of genuine refugees.

The Duty of Government - Control our borders

Compassion with the suffering of people elsewhere in the world must not conflict with the preservation of our own communities. Citizens of this country have legitimate expectations from their government. We have a justified expectation of stability, security, the rule of law, and prosperity. But *all* that is threatened if so much changes so rapidly it changes for the worse. We need what we do not yet have: Effective border controls that allow quick access to genuine refugees who meet our criteria.

Sharia Pushers - Islam reshapes the refugee question

The new element in the current refugee crisis is that of Islam. Muslims bring with them a mind-set and philosophy that teaches they are superior to non-Muslims and that they have an obligation to conquer and rule over non-Muslim peoples, or convert them. This is simply the theological and historical reality. Other religions (and atheism) do not have that interior/spiritual engine which pushes them to create, by force if necessary, a particular political arrangement in all of society. The influx of more Sharia-pushers - and there are a growing number among us even now - would create a political landscape of which Mohammed, the founder of Islam, would be proud. The

burden on our communities can only increase, e.g. on housing, social services, the imposition of halal food, growing misogyny, lack of integration and cultural clashes, etc. Furthermore, ISIS has clearly said that they are sending jihadists with the refugees to live here and plan and execute our destruction.

Growing European Anger

No foreigner has an absolute right of abode in any other country. That is an EU fiction that is finally being put to the test.

Angela Merkel, the German Chancellor, has reinstated internal border controls because Germany cannot cope with the initial wave of the 800,000 immigrants that she promised to take in.

On 19 September 2015, Hungarian PM, Viktor Orbán has finally dug his heels in and said 'No more'; 'We must keep Europe Christian.' "I am not speaking about God. I am speaking about culture and the everyday principles of life, such as sexual habits, freedom of expression, equality between men and women and all those kind of values which I call Christianity. If we let the Muslims into the continent to compete with us, they will outnumber us. It's mathematics. And we don't like it," he said. The Hungarians do not like it and neither do we!

We must plan fairly for future English generations

On this issue, the countless promises made and broken by this Government in the past are proof that any promises made now and in the future are worthless. The resulting credibility problem is one that cannot be resolved overnight.

The sense of compassion and fairness of the English people is deep and integral to our history, traditions and culture. But our tradition of fairness has a rational component; we try to look to the future and consider the consequences of today's decisions. We try, deliberately and formally, to be rational and to avoid being swamped by passing emotion and knee-jerk over-reaction.

Therefore, in solidarity with the Hungarian people and a growing number of citizens throughout Europe, we say: No more!
